Ka'ōnohi Awards Honor Contributions to Hawaiian Health

HONOLULU – Papa Ola Lōkahi will honor community leaders for their contributions to Hawaiian health on Saturday, April 23, at the Waikīkī Beach Marriott.

The Kaʻōnohi Awards are named for Alexander Friedenburg Kaʻōhiai Kaʻōnohi, a naturopathic physician, pharmacist and botanist, descended from a long line of healers, whose daily healing practice included both western and Hawaiian traditions. He is believed to be the first Hawaiian doctor to own his own clinic. Dr. Kaʻōnohi also encouraged other Hawaiians to enter medicine and nursing by personally providing scholarships.

"The award is named for Dr. Ka'ōnohi because he pioneered the integration of traditional Hawaiian healing with medicine," said Hardy Spoehr, executive director of Papa Ola Lōkahi. "It is important to honor those have made significant contributions to the health, healing and wellness of Native Hawaiians and their 'ohana. These recognitions are overdue."

Among those being recognized on April 23rd are family physician and Hōkūle'a voyager **Nathan A.K. Wong**; lā'au lapa'au practitioner **Alapa'i Kahuena**; ho'oponopono practitioners and social workers **Richard & Lynette Paglinawan**; psychiatrist and Hawaiian health advocate **Naleen N. Andrade**; and Hawaii Island activist **Pele Hanoa**.
